FootZone's Sixth Annual "I Like Pie" Run/Walk Supports NeighborImpact

October 9, 2011, Bend, Or. – FootZone is again hosting the 6th Annual I LIKE PIE run/walk and pie baking contest on Thanksgiving morning November 24th, at 9 am. Last year 675 participants brought 80 pies, raised \$3,662 and donated 2,500 lbs. of food to NeighborImpact.

This year's event will be held at the Riverfront Plaza in downtown Bend (Brooks Street behind FootZone). The recommended cost to enter the event is a \$5 donation (cash or check) and 5 cans of food for NeighborImpact. A NeighborImpact Food Recovery Truck will be on site to collect donations. Event T-shirts may be purchased for an additional amount.

Don't forget to bring along a pie to help feed the masses as well! If you choose to, your pie can be entered into the pie baking contest. Prizes will be awarded for the top 3 pies in both the "traditional" and "open" pie category. The Bend High Culinary Program is running the Pie Contest again this year with the help of local celebrity judges.

This year's untimed event will follow a course along the 1st Street River Trail starting and finishing behind FootZone. The turnaround for 2K, 5K and 10K will be marked. The 10 mile turnaround is the green gate at the end of the trail.
